# Students return to learning at the Dryden Centre

There can be no denying that the main challenge which has faced us all this year has been the COVID-19 pandemic. As we adjust to a 'new normal', students at Gateshead's learningSkills SoTA site at the Dryden Centre have returned to their learning programmes.

LearningSkills Employability Manager Melanie Crosby: "Covid has had a dramatic effect on our learners, so we have been very careful to try and make things as safe, but also as normal as we can. Staff are wearing masks and visors where necessary, but we have introduced new clear masks that are particularly good for those learners who use Makaton or who rely on facial expressions to aid communication. Learners wear masks where they are able to and they have all be taught the hands, face, space rules. We've kept class sizes as small as possible to ensure social distancing and put in additional measures to co-ordinate lunch times safely."

Learners have responded well to the changes and are happy to be back.

"I was sad being off for so long, I missed my friends", said Louise Christian, a student at the Dryden Centre's SoTA building. Fellow student Ben Nichols is also pleased to be back: "The best thing about coming back is seeing friends and staff again and using the new computers."

# **Gateshead Autism Information Hub**

The Autism Information Hub is a volunteer-run initiative supported by Gateshead Council. The service offers information, advice, support and signposting for anyone affected by autism including parents, carers and family members, autistic individuals, and professionals.

Under normal circumstances the Autism Hub operates out of the Elgin Children's Centre in Deckham. Monthly drop-in sessions are held for visitors to meet up, browse our extensive information files, or chat informally. However, in March 2020 the Elgin Centre closed due to the Covid pandemic lockdown and unfortunately face to face drop-ins and meetings had to cease. Karen Thirlaway, the Hub's main coordinator, explains how the group has adapted to the current pandemic:

'In April I introduced weekly online meetings for the support group. We don't keep contact details for those who've attended the Hub drop-ins, but I maintain a mailing list for parents and carers who have shown an interest in the support group, and this formed the basis of the online meetings. I also continue to take email enquiries, generally from parents and practitioners, which I answer to the best of my ability. It should be noted though that I'm not an autism professional but the parent of a young adult – my knowledge has been developed by twenty years of lived experience and by



listening to and learning from other parents' stories, and my links to professionals, practitioners and agencies.'

Gateshead Autism Hub will continue to operate a virtual service until we are able to safely reintroduce our face-to-face clinics. For general enquiries email <a href="mailto:karen.thirlaway@blueyonder.co.uk">karen.thirlaway@blueyonder.co.uk</a>
