Connor's Pathway to Employment

A young Gateshead resident is about to take the next step on his journey into employment. Seventeen-year-old Connor Mudie, who attends Dryden School's Sixth Form, has been offered a job with the NHS following a successful work experience placement organised by the school and Health Education England.

"I'm starting as soon as we get the paperwork sorted," says Connor. "I've been doing work experience there for the past three months. I wash the ambulances and buses for other people to drive them. My job will be 20 hours a week over four days."

Connor has secured his role through determination and a strong work ethic. "I like to work," he says. "I wash cars, I work for the school café making the food - I've been making sausage sandwiches! I like doing gardening – cutting grass – or working on the farm. I love doing these type of things. I'm just waiting for my wages to come through. I'd like more hours cos you get paid more!"

Connor is rightfully proud of his achievements and also has praise for the way Dryden School have helped him achieve his ambitions. "I get loads of



help when I'm at school. I talk to staff a lot about things that's been happening. I'm definitely proud of myself. My mam and dad's proud. Work experience has helped me. When I work problems go away - it makes me feel good about myself."

Gateshead Independent Travel Training

Hello, my name is Nicola. I have recently joined the Travel Care Team as the new Travel Trainer.

The travel team provide assisted transport to vulnerable people whose



additional needs mean that they are unable to independently travel. My role is to liaise with schools, parents and other multidisciplinary teams to identify young people and adults who may safely undertake independent travel training and become able to use public transport. Young people tell us that being an independent traveler increases their confidence and self-esteem, reduces the reliance on parents/family members, supports friendships and gives them a greater choice of post-16 curriculum options. I am a strong advocate for giving people the opportunity to have more choice, control and independence and I find the role deeply rewarding.

British Sign Language 999 App

A new service has launched to allow people to make 999 calls using British Sign Language (BSL). The new service - 999 BSL - allows deaf people to make emergency calls using an app or website, connecting callers with a BSL interpreter.

The system, which launched in June, is the first time a 999 emergency service has been available in British Sign Language, though a similar process exists for the NHS 111 number.

People who use the service will be put through to a BSL interpreter, who will then relay the conversation to a 999 operator.

The service is free to use and operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week. It is available to download as a <u>Download : 999 BSL</u> and access as a <u>web-based platform at 999bsl.co.uk</u>.
