A Parenting Support Programme for Parents and Carers of Children aged 2 - 5 with Autism





What is EarlyBird?

The EarlyBird Parenting Programme supports parents and carers of pre-school children aged 2-5 years with a diagnosis of autism.

The programme aims to support families to:

- understand autism
- understand and support sensory differences
- develop communication
- support and develop Interaction
- understand and develop play
- understand and Interpret behaviour
- support behaviour

The programme is delivered by Early Years professionals from Gateshead Council's High Incidence Needs Team (HINT) in two-hour session on mornings over eight weeks. There is a shorter introductory session.

Is EarlyBird for me?

This programme is for parents and carers of children who have received a **diagnosis of Autism**.

After a diagnosis, parents and carers can have a lot of questions about autism and may feel isolated in managing their child's needs. Attending EarlyBird gives parents and carers an opportunity to develop their understanding of autism and look at practical solutions to managing behaviour. It also provides an opportunity to meet other people in a similar position and hear about their experiences in an informal but supportive atmosphere.

Do I have to attend all the sessions?

Yes. You will gain a lot more from coming to the group if you come to all sessions. This is because each session builds on the one before. Please do not accept an EarlyBird place if you are not able to commit to attend ALL sessions.

How do I get on a course and when do they run?

Parents and carers should self-refer by completing the referral form on the back page of this leaflet and returning it by post or email.

Please note: we do not release the dates for forthcoming courses until we have enough participants to go ahead. The courses run at least every term and are arranged according to demand. Families will receive an acknowledgement upon receipt of their application with further details and dates to follow.

Can professionals refer families to this programme?

We believe that parents/carers themselves are best placed to decide if and when a parenting course is right for them which is why we ask parents/carers to self-refer.
